All parents are required to give six weeks notice of any amendments to their child's sessions; this also includes


Allergy Alert

Healthy eating

Barkston Ash Nursery promotes healthy eating so please can you ensure your child's drinking bottle contains water only and there are no sweets or chocolate in lunchbox's, the nursery provides healthy snack including fruit and vegetables.





New Starters

Your child will be allocated a 'key person' who will be responsible for their day to day care. Your child's key person will be your first point of call; they will be responsible for your child's on-going development as well as providing you with regular updates. We have an 'open' door policy so that any questions you may have can be answered promptly.

Name Labelling

Please can we ask all parents to name their child's items. Bags, clothes, shoes and lunch boxes all need labelling so we can avoid any unnecessary confusion. Nappies, wipes and spare clothes all need to be provided by the parents.

Illness – I*M*P*O*R*T*A*N*T COVID 19 Pandemic

We appreciate that at the moment it is very difficult to ascertain whether a child has a simple cold or is displaying symptoms of Covid 19 – Nursery will use 'Temperature' as the main guauge. Any child who has a temperature of 37.7 degrees or above will be isolated and sent home. Normal temperature range is 36.5 - 37.5 (NHS). Please note, we do not give Calpol or Ibuprofen.

The national regulations for sickness and diahorrea states that there must be a minimum of 48 hours clear from the last episodethese have been set for a reason and we will be enforcing these. We appreciate that this may cause inconvenience to some, however, we have a duty of care to everybody. It is important that you ring and let us know immediately if your child can not attend a session due to illness so that this can be recorded appropriately. We will not accept any child that is still symptomatic to ensure that we minimise the spread of infection. Thank you for your support in this important matter.

Letters and Sounds

Barkston Ash Nursery follows the 'Read write inc' letters and sounds. This system is working very well, and most or all children will know all the letter sounds before starting school with some able to blend sounds to create basic words.

This phonic based programme enables children to learn the correct letter sound to help 'blend' words when they are becoming readers. Although letter sounds will be used throughout the setting, we will only introduce the full programme of letters and sounds with the more able children who are ready for the next stage. All members of staff have received relevant training to ensure that this system can be introduced correctly. If you are teaching your child at home to write letters, please can you ensure that this is lower case only. As part of the read write programme we will teach children the correct letter formation. If you are unsure of the correct letter sound and letter formation, please speak to your child's key worker.

You can support your child's learning by practicing 'sounds' with them in the home environment. To help you, the following link demonstrates exactly how to pronounce the sounds;-

FUNDING

2 year old funding

Your 2 year old child may be eligible for funding. If you, your spouse/partner are on job seekers allowance, housing benefit, income support or other matching criteria, please look at Childcare choices website to see if you are eligible – you could be entitled to 15 hours free nursery funding.

3 & 4 year old Funding

Any child eligible for funding (the term after your child becomes 3) is entitled to a total of 15 or 30 hours free of charge. This entitlement does not include or cover alternative sessions we provide. You will be invoiced separately for any additional sessions.
